Access a Private Storage Container from an ASP.NET Web App [Guided]	In this challenge, you will write code to access an Azure storage account with a private container, upload files to the account, generate a SAS token for the container, and test private access to the account. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Access a Public Storage Container from an ASP.NET Web App [Guided]	In this challenge, you will write code to access an Azure Storage account used by the web app. First, you will write code in Visual Studio to create a container that has public blob access, and then you will upload test files to the container. Next, you will write code to retrieve the URLs of the uploaded files. Finally, you will test the configuration by using a test page provided with the web app. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Access an Azure SQL Database by Using Azure AD Authentication [Guided]	In this challenge, you will provision a new Azure SQL database that uses Azure Active Directory (Azure AD) authentication for data security. First, you will deploy an Azure SQL database. Next, you will enable Azure AD authentication. Finally, you will test the data security access. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Access Document-Based Data in MongoDB by Using Node.js [Guided]	In this Challenge Lab, you will create a utility that loads, reads, and modifies sales order data in a MongoDB database. First, you will create a collection in MongoDB, and then you will load JSON sales order data from files into the collection. Next, you will retrieve sales orders from the collection, and then modify data in the collection. Finally, you will add exception handling to catch errors thrown while interacting with the data. Note: Once you begin the Challenge Lab, you will not be able to pause, save, or exit and then return to your Challenge Lab. Please ensure that you have set aside enough time to complete the Challenge Lab before you start.
Access File Data by Using C# [Guided]	In this challenge you will use C# to process data from files. You will read data from comma-separated value (CSV) files, process individual records, and manipulate sets of data with C#. Finally, you will write data to a CSV file. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Access File Data by Using Node.js [Guided]	In this Challenge Lab you will write code to read a JSON file containing a customer record into an object, and then return the object representing the customer. Next, you will write code that will read a file with multiple lines each representing a product record, then clean each line, then convert each line into an object, and then return an array of the objects representing the products. Finally, you will process multiple comma-separated values (CSV) files that contain transaction data, filter the data, sort the data, slice the data, and return an array with all remaining transactions.
Access File Data by Using Python [Guided]	In this challenge you will use Python to process data from files. You will read data from comma-separated value (CSV) files, process individual records, and manipulate sets of data with Python. Finally, you will write data to a CSV file. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Access MongoDB Data by Using C# [Guided]	In this Challenge Lab, you create a utility that loads, reads, and modifies sales order data in a MongoDB database. First, you will create a collection in MongoDB, and then you will load JSON sales order data from files into the database. Next, you will retrieve sales orders from the database, and then write data to the database. Finally, you will add exception handling to catch any errors thrown while interacting with the data. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.

Access MongoDB Data by Using Python [Guided]	In this challenge you will read and write document-based data using Python and MongoDB. Finally they will add code to handle common errors that occur while working with MongoDB. Please ensure that you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge lab before you start.
Access Relational Data by Using C# [Guided]	In this Challenge Lab, you will create a utility that interacts with a relational database. First, you will write C# code that connects to the database. Next, you will write code that reads data from the database, and then you will write code that writes data to the database. Finally, you will add exception handling to catch errors thrown while interacting with the data. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Access Relational Data by Using Node.js [Guided]	In this Challenge Lab, you will learn how to access relational data by using Node.js. First, you will load a relational database, and then you will write Node.js code that connects to the database. Next, you will write code that retrieves data from the database, and then you will write code that modifies data in the database. Finally, you will add exception handling to catch any errors thrown while interacting with the data. Access Relational Data by Using Python [Guided]	In this challenge, you will create a utility that interacts with a relational database. Add and Manage Domain Controllers [Guided]	In this challenge, you will manage domain controllers by deploying a new domain controller to an existing domain and configuring it as a Global Catalog server, installing Active Directory Domain Services (AD DS) binaries to a member server, promoting the member server to a domain controller, and verifying creation of Domain Name Server (DNS) SRV records for the new domain controller. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Address Dates, Times, and Datetime Functions in MySQL [Guided]	In this challenge you will write several MySQL queries by using date and time functions. First, you will develop queries that return the current system date and time. Next, you will develop more specific queries that will use the FORMAT function for formatting date and time data. Finally, you will explore queries that use the DATEDIFF and DATEADD functions for performing calculations on date and time data. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Analyze Network Communications [Guided]	In this Challenge Lab, you will evaluate network speeds and discover information about systems within a network. First, you will perform several Internet speed tests. Next, you will perform a local network speed test. Finally, you will discover other computers, identify open ports, determine operating systems, and discover active services by performing nmap scans. Note: Once you begin the challenge lab, you will not be able to pause, save, or exit and then return to your challenge lab. Assess Database Performance by Using Query Performance Insight [Guided]	In this challenge, you will create an Amazon Simple Storage Service (Amazon S3) bucket that will contain assets for a website that you will be hosting. The website must be accessible to a group of web administrators. First, you will create an Amazon S3 bucket to store the assets, and then you will create a user account for the web administrator. Next, you will create an Identity and Access Management (IAM) policy that provides full control of the bucket, and then you will create a new group. Finally, you will assign the IAM policy to the group, and then you will add the web administrator to the group. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Assign Environment and Shell Variables in Linux [Guided]	In this challenge, you will automate administration tasks by using variables. First, you will define environment variables by using bash, and then you will use the variables in Linux commands. Next, you will define shell variables, and then you will use the variables in Linux commands. Finally, you will define shell variables by using command substitution. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Assigning Admin Roles [Guided]	In this challenge, you will assign Admin roles to various users. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Automate Administration Tasks by Using Linux Shell Scripts [Guided]	In this challenge, you will automate administration tasks by using bash shell scripts. First, you will create a shell script that displays the day of the week, and then you will create a shell script search utility to locate files. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Automate Database Maintenance Tasks by Using SQL Server Agent [Guided]	In this challenge, you will configure maintenance jobs by using SQL Server Agent in an Azure virtual machine that hosts SQL Server. First, you will create an Azure storage account to host backups. Next, you will access the Azure virtual machine, and then you will enable SQL Server Agent. Finally, you will create a SQL Server Agent job. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Automate Snapshots by Using DLM [Guided]	In this challenge, you will configure automated snapshots of the Elastic Block Store (EBS) volumes on your web servers. First, you will create tags for your volumes. Next, you will create an Amazon Data Lifecycle Manager (DLM) lifecycle policy that uses an hourly schedule, and then you will verify that a snapshot was created. Finally, you will replace the root volume on a web server by using a snapshot. Note: Once you begin the challenge lab, you will not be able to pause, save, or exit and then return to your challenge lab. Please ensure that you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge lab before you start.
Automate the Deployment of an Azure Virtual Machine by Using an Azure Resource Manager Template [Guided]	In this challenge, you will automate the deployment of an Azure virtual machine by using an Azure Resource Manager (ARM) template. First, you will deploy a virtual machine that runs Windows by using a modified Azure Resource Manager quickstart template, and then you will save the existing deployment to a new ARM template. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Autoscale a Web App [Guided]	In this challenge, you will configure and test autoscale for an Azure web app. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
AZ-104T00-A Microsoft Azure Administrator [Azure Pass Required]	This course teaches IT Professionals how to manage their Azure subscriptions, secure identities, administer the infrastructure, configure virtual networking, connect Azure and on-premises sites, manage network traffic, implement storage solutions, create and scale virtual machines, implement web apps and containers, back up and share data, and monitor your solution.

<p>AZ-500T00-A Microsoft Azure Security Technologies [No Azure Pass Required]</p>	<p>In this course students will gain the knowledge and skills needed to implement security controls, maintain the security posture, and identify and remediate vulnerabilities by using a variety of security tools. The course covers scripting and automation, virtualization, and cloud N-tier architecture. Includes access to the Microsoft course labs aligned with the AZ-500T00-A: Microsoft Azure Security Technologies course and supporting Challenge Labs.</p>
<p>AZ-801T00 Configuring Windows Server Hybrid Advanced Services [Azure Pass Required]</p>	<p>This course teaches IT Professionals to configure advanced Windows Server services using on-premises, hybrid, and cloud technologies. The course teaches IT Professionals how to leverage the hybrid capabilities of Azure, how to migrate virtual and physical server workloads to Azure IaaS, and how to secure Azure VMs running Windows Server. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Backup and Restore Files with CPIO in Linux [Guided]	In this challenge, you will use the cpio backup and restore utility to protect your files, and use the md5sum file to ensure the integrity of your backup jobs. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Backup and Restore Files with Tar in Linux [Guided]	In this challenge, you will utilize tar and gzip to backup and restore files. You will also verify the integrity of files utilizing the md5sum utility. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Backup Windows Server 2019 by Using Azure Backup [Guided]	In this challenge, you will back up Windows Server 2019 by using Azure Backup. First, you will create an Azure Recovery Services vault. Next, you will deploy the Microsoft Azure Recovery Services agent. Finally, you will schedule a backup job by using Microsoft Azure Backup. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Build a Network by Using the VPC Wizard [Guided]	In this challenge, you will create a custom VPC with public and private subnets, and an Internet and NAT Gateway, and then you will associate route tables with the correct subnets. <p>Can You Administer a Windows Server 2019 Hybrid Environment? [Advanced]</p>	<p>In this challenge, you will administer a Windows Server 2019 environment. First, you will register Windows Admin Center with Microsoft Azure, and then you will configure Azure Update Management by using Windows Admin Center. Next, you will deploy the Microsoft monitoring agent on Windows Server 2019, and then you will enable Azure Monitor for VMs and implement Azure File Sync. Next, you will configure a point-to-site VPN between Windows Server 2019 and Microsoft Azure. Finally, you will implement synchronization between Azure AD and Active Directory Domain Services. Note: Once you begin the challenge lab, you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your challenge lab. Please ensure that you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge lab before you start.</p>
<p>Can You Administer and Monitor Windows Server 2016? [Expert]</p>	<p>In this challenge, you will administer local and remote servers that run Windows Server 2016. First, you will configure log files, and then you will configure monitoring. Next, you will administer a server by using Windows PowerShell. Finally, you will configure a server by using a PowerShell Desired State Configuration (DSC) script. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.</p>
<p>Can You Administer Computers by Using Windows Admin Center? [Advanced]</p>	<p>In this challenge, you will deploy Windows Server 2019 Server Core. First, you will install and configure Windows Server 2019 Server Core, and then you will install Features on Demand in Server Core. Next, you will join a Server Core computer to a domain. Finally, you will promote the Server Core computer to an Active Directory domain controller. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.</p>

Can You Administer Windows Server 2016 Remotely? [Advanced]	In this challenge, you will manage multiple remote Windows servers. First, you will execute noninteractive Windows PowerShell® commands that will run on a remote computer. Next, you will establish an interactive PowerShell session. Finally, you will use Server Manager to manage remote servers. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Can You Aggregate Data by Using Transact-SQL? [Advanced]	In this challenge, you will write several Transact-SQL (T-SQL) queries by using data types and functions. First, you will launch Microsoft SQL Server Management Studio (SSMS), and then you will develop queries that use string parsing to extract data. Next, you will develop more specific queries that will use the FORMAT function for formatting date and time data. Finally, you will explore queries that use the DATEDIFF and DATEADD functions for performing calculations on date and time data. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Can You Aggregate Data from Multiple Tables in Transact-SQL? [Expert]	In this challenge, you will write several Transact-SQL queries to summarize data from multiple tables. First, you will launch Microsoft SQL Server Management Studio (SSMS), and then you will write a query by using inner and outer joins. Next, you will develop a query that uses the DATEDIFF and DATEADD functions for performing calculations on date and time data. Finally, you will develop a query that aggregates data by using the GROUP BY and HAVING clauses. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Can You Automate Administrative Tasks in Linux by Using Cron and Scripting? [Advanced]	In this challenge, you will use command line tools to manage user accounts, groups and group memberships, including the creation of an administrator account, and add a GUI tool to manage users. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Can You Automate and Manage Custom, Scalable Azure VM–Based Infrastructure Solutions? [Expert]	In this challenge, you will configure high availability by using availability zones and autoscale. First, you will convert a virtual machine that contains a web app into a scale set that uses availability zones for high availability. Next, you will configure autoscale. Finally, you will deploy an update to the scale set by using a custom script extension. Note: Once you begin a challenge you will not be able to pause, save, or return to your progress. Please ensure you have set aside enough time to complete the challenge before you start.
Can You Automate Database Maintenance Tasks? [Advanced]	In this challenge, you will automate maintenance tasks for a SQL Server database. First, you will create a Recovery Services vault by using the Azure portal. Next, you will restore a SQL Server database on an Azure virtual machine, and then you will configure Azure Backup for the SQL Server database.
